- Global pilot sites' in 2010
 - Nairobi
 - Desamparados (San Jose)
 - Kuala Lumpur
 - Dushanbe
 - Moscow and St Petersburg
 - Cairo

- Conduct Real-Time Evaluations in such 'pilot sites' in order to identify good practices
- Late 2010: Policy
 Development and
 Evaluation Service will
 conduct a series of real time evaluations in
 these pilot sites
- Plus cross-functional lessons learned workshop, to analyze urban policy implementation in broader number of urban programmes

- Slight amendment to UNHCR's urban refugee policy to benefit from the many valuable observations and suggestions made during the Dialogue
- Amended version to be issued in the second half of 2010
- Operational guidance has begun
 - combating xenophobia and racism (issued)
 - pocket guide on working with communities and local authorities (in pipeline)
 - urban livelihoods (in pipeline)

 Compile and share good 'urban' practices in a range of areas

- Compilation has begun and will be discussed further during NGO Consultations (June)
- RTEs and lessonslearned workshop will shed light on other good practices
- UNHCR will seek broader IASC engagement through 'humanitarian challenges' task force

- Advocate jointly with Walter Kälin, RSG for the Human Rights of IDPs and members of the Inter-Agency Standing Committee, for a common approach for non-camp and/or urban-based IDPs
- We have already begun exploring the issue with RSG Kälin
- We agree that more can be done to reach out to IDPs living outside of camps, whether in host family arrangements or in cities
- To be on the agenda of one of the forthcoming IASC meetings

Other

Finalization of a joint study on potential cooperation on urban displacement issues between UNHCR and the Cities Alliance: Completed – now with Cities Alliance for publication

Other

- UNHCR-UN Habitat Side event at the World Urban Forum in Rio (22-26 March 2010)
- Urban Refugee Policy will be part of the planning process for 2011

 Situations (PRS) is a central policy priority for UNHCR

2008 Protracted Situations Dialogue

Impact

- Demonstrably rekindled interest in and galvanized action on protracted refugee (and IDP) situations
- Bureau presentations over this week have highlighted progress in attaining solutions
- Informal update summarizing action taken in follow-up to the Dialogue is available in back of the room

2008 Protracted Situations Dialogue

 UNHCR is equally committed to improving, to the extent possible, the situation of refugees in many PRS, not just the five situations encompassed in the 2008 High Commissioner's Initiative on Protracted Refugee Situations.

2007 Asylum-Migration Dialogue

- Follow-up to the HC's first dialogue on Protection Challenges has variously included:
 - Activities under the 10 Point Plan on Refugee Protection and Mixed Migration (rev. January 2007);
 - Research and development of policy papers on various topics;

2007 Asylum-Migration Dialogue

- Addressing the protection challenges in the context of rescue-at-sea operations in which refugees and migrants are involved, and
- Activities related to refugee protection and human trafficking.

2007 Asylum-Migration Dialogue

Impact

- Much more awareness and interest among stakeholders of protection challenges in the context of mixed migration
- Much closer inter-agency cooperation, coordination and understanding with IOM, OHCHR, UNICEF and UNODC
- IOM: more strategic dialogue and cooperation
