## What are the TEC's objectives?

- To promote a sector-wide approach to learning from the tsunami response in order to promote improved performance.
- To develop, test and validate processes for the future timely establishment of such an evaluation coordination mechanism that could facilitate such an approach.

The learning is not only for ongoing operations but also the next big humanitarian response.

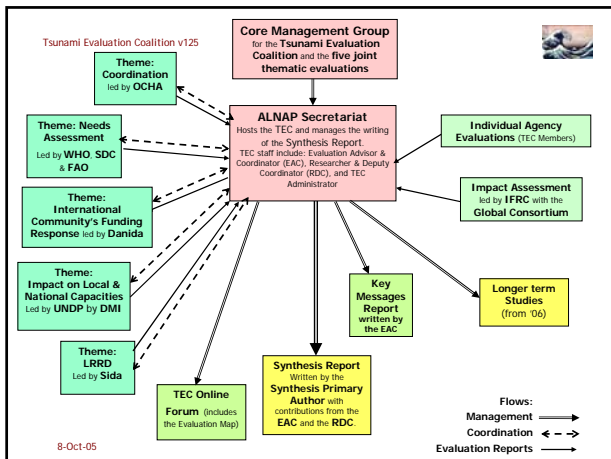
## What's in it for me?
